Dear Residents, Families & Staff:

Yesterday, a group of 30 residents, board members and staff joined together in a Mission, Vision and Values Summit intended to train interviewers in the process of Appreciative Inquiry. Appreciative Inquiry is an approach that focuses on the positive. We are looking to stakeholders to help identify all that is good about Dunwoody Village. The interviewer group had the opportunity to interview a partner using Appreciative Inquiry which included 4 questions. These questions focus on the best of Dunwoody in the past, the present and the future. The interviewers will now go out into the Dunwoody community to interview those people who have agreed to be interviewed. There are still invitations being sent to residents and staff to be interviewed. If you are asked, please say "Yes!" We need your input for this important process. We intend for 100 interviews to be completed over the next 2-week period. Yesterday 30 interviews were completed. This group will reconvene to review the themes that were heard in the interviews. These themes will be considered as the Mission, Vision and Values are reviewed. This group will also make recommendations regarding updating the same.

Once completed, we believe this will be a great addition to Dunwoody Villages' landscape.
