Employee ID Badges

All staff members are required to wear employee badges <u>at all times while at Dunwoody Village</u>, including when you are entering and exiting the building. Your employee ID badge will greatly assist our receptionists in fulfilling their building security responsibilities.

Infection Control

Two Residential and two Care Center residents tested positive for COVID and two Care Center residents tested for RSV. All are on quarantine. Two staff members tested positive for COVID and are at home on isolation.

WiFi Project

The installation of the new WiFi will begin in the next several weeks. There are two main reasons for this system replacement. First, we feel we can get a better system installed with more consistent connectivity and faster upload and download speeds. Second, our contract with our current provider is expiring and we needed to seek an alternative solution before the contract ends in the Spring of 2025. Our existing system is a leased system that is managed by a third-party monitoring company. The new system will be a system owned by Dunwoody and managed 24/7 by our new Information Technology (IT) partner SSI/Meriplex. We feel this new system will have better coverage and faster speeds than the existing system and will be a crucial element in helping us build our technology infrastructure and programs for the future. We are in the process of working with our project team to outline implementation, phasing and outages during the installation. More information will be distributed as we develop the details of the project. Lower-Level Renovation

The renovations to the Lower Level of the community building are scheduled to begin on Monday, January 20th. The work will begin in Furniture Hall and will proceed outside of the Kitchen, to the entrance of Health and Wellness and to the area that includes the vending machines near the East Country hallway and elevator to skilled nursing. This scope of work includes:

- Replace the ceiling tiles
- Painting of walls, doors, trim and handrails

• New Flooring (with the exception of Furniture Hall since the carpet there was replaced in 2022) The flooring material has been delayed by a few weeks so there will be a period of time between the floor preparation and the new flooring installation. This means that the floor will be exposed concrete. Temporary signage will be put up during this work for wayfinding. Much of the ceiling and flooring work will occur off hours and at night and will not require any closures for traffic. We will be sure to communicate any closures or traffic pattern changes ahead of time.

J-Hallway Renovation

The work in the J-Hall Administrative and Marketing Offices, Club Room, Board Room and Gift Shop is expected to be completed in the middle of February. Painting has started, ceiling tiles are being installed, ceramic tile, casework and countertops have been installed, doors are being delivered and installed in the next few days and flooring will begin next week. Once the work is complete, permits will be closed and furniture will be installed, likely in early to mid-March. Once furniture has been installed the staff will move into the offices. We plan to host a ribbon cutting and open house for all of the areas.
